

All products are handwoven, fulled, and finished by Robert Stone. He uses factory-spun and dyed yarns of 100% natural fibers. Hand washing or drycleaning these goods is recommended. Due to the nature of this type of production, dimensions may vary slightly from those listed. Prices listed do not include shipping costs. Quantity prices apply to blankets of the same size and warp. POINT BLANKETS - Introduced by the French in the early 1700's and continued by the British, point blan-

kets remain popular today. Ours are a heavy wool and have a thick nap. Historically, the most common point blankets were natural white with a single dark blue stripe at each end along with the point marks. The points indicate the size and value of the blanket. $2\frac{1}{2}$ and 3 point sizes were the most popular. We stock them in white and will make them in other colors to order. 1 through 3 point sizes are available in attached pairs.



ROSE BLANKETS – The rose blanket was one of the most common blankets used in America from the mid 1700's to the mid 1800's. They were imported from England and also produced here in the United States. Multi-colored motifs (resembling a compass "rose") were embroidered into the corners of a white wool blanket. Rob has looked at over 150 of these blankets in

museum collections. Our rose patterns are hand embroidered from originals.

DUFFEL BLANKETS – A close relative to the English rose blanket is the duffel blanket. Woven of natural white wool in a plain weave, these blankets had a series of blue, red, or brown stripes on each end. They came with a nap, but were not hemmed. Duffel blankets were popular in the first quarter of the 1800's. They were a common, simple blanket of a medium weight. We make ours in a 7/4 size (63x81").

BRITISH MILITARY BLANKETS - This style of blanket was used by the British military from at least the

Revolutionary War through the War of 1812. Ours are composites of 13 examples that Rob has researched in museums. They are a natural white wool, woven "duffel style" in a single width with thin double stripes on each end. They are 67x86" and the ends are cut and unfinished. The blankets are napped. This blanket comes in two types, one for the Rev. War and one for the 1812 period. They differ only in the stripe color (blue or brown) and the placement of the king's cipher (GR and broad arrow). The cipher is block printed.
